Behind the Scene this winter

Renegotiating the NCCFC Contract:

This winter it was time to renegotiate the contract with the Noble County Fair board. They, as we ,are a nonprofit organization. The fairgrounds is 65 or so acres that require maintenance to keep them in shape. The obvious requirements are mowing but there are others like upkeep on roads, electrical support for all the buildings and the camping areas.

Water annually has to be drained from all the lines so they don't freeze in the cold weather. Restrooms need attention and some are in disrepair almost beyond saving.

Against this background it is obvious that this not-for-profit, volunteer organization needs help both monetary and physical to keep going. Not mentioned is the need to organize and put on the annual 4H Fair, a major project on very limited funds.

An obvious source of more money is to raise rent on the existing major renters, the Apple Festival and the two Bluegrass festivals. This endeavor required a delicate balance, ensuring fairness to all parties involved. Joe facilitated the development of an updated three-year contract that addressed the needs and concerns of all stakeholders involved.

Advertising:

Since COVID, people have turned more and more to forms of entertainment that doesn't include being in a large crowd. In the process they have lost the feeling that comes from enjoying entertainment in an audience. It also impacts the performers who need feedback from an audience. This trend has impacted live music like us.

In the past, the club would distributed 10,000 or more paper flyers to the many locations that had Bluegrass events. The number of those events has been dropping and that accelerated during COVID. NIBGA has searched for alternatives.

The web site was updated and included information on our events. The Facebook page had details on the bands that were planning to appear. Our visibility improved but those efforts seemed to only reach a specific, limited Bluegrass audience. We were very fortunate to have as a member, Evan Argueta, who has extensive experience in the promotion of corporations on the web as his day job. He and his wife joined Julie Goldsmith's team and began to expand our advertising reach on the internet. Having a volunteer professional was a stroke of luck.

Instead of just putting up Facebook pages which bring limited results, they implemented advertising directly to specific groups on Facebook and via Google ads to RV owners, festival go'ers, specific age groups and more.

Using tracking cookies allowed them to obtain information about potential festival attendees. This allows feedback on the effectiveness of their efforts allowing them to shift advertising directions and funding based on solid information instead of guessing like in the past.

The board has high hopes to see a significant increase in attendance at the festival.
