We have also been fortunate recently in receiving grants from the Indiana Arts Council (IAC). Although we have received grants in the past, the IAC has truly stepped up with funds that will help us shape and improve the event in the future – we already see those effects in this year's lineup. Many thanks to Julie Goldsmith and her team for handling the grant filings – as I write this column, they are preparing the necessary reports to document our use of IAC funds.

As I mentioned last month, we've been trying to get **Volume Five** for a while, since they earned their IBMA Emerging Artist of the Year award in 2017. They feature some nice original material and creative arrangements. Fiddler Glen Harrell is their primary lead vocalist, with guitarist Jacob Burleson and mandolinist Aaron Ramsey providing stellar harmonies. Chris Wade is a real fivedriver on banjo; and Jacob Eller is on string bass.

When I was just getting into bluegrass music (a few years ago), much of my inspiration came from a young band called the **McLain Family Band**.

Their fresh approach to the music, as well as their friendliness and approachability, made an instant fan of me. They have now been performing for over 50 years, and the current membership has the familiar faces of Raymond McLain on fiddle, Al White on guitar, Alice White on mandolin, and Ruth McLain on string bass. The "new" guy in the lineup is Daxson Lewis, who has been with the group several years and is currently the Director of Traditional Music at the Kentucky Center for Traditional Music at Morehead State University. Their web site is spot on in saying they have "become internationally known as one of the most spontaneous, creative and spirited groups performing original and traditional bluegrass music."

I first learned about Liam Purcell and Cane Mill Road when they contacted us through the NIBGA Facebook in 2019. They were fresh off garnering an IBMA Momentum Band of the Year award at that time, and I was instantly impressed upon hearing their original and inspired approach to the music.

Liam originally hails from Deep Gap, North Carolina, not far from the home of Doc Watson, and he obviously draws inspiration from Doc's old timey roots music. But his brand of bluegrass is not anchored in the classic Stanley/Monroe/ Flatt & Scruggs sounds of 1940's and 50's. Continued on last page
