Well, now that the 2024 outdoor blue grass festivals are mostly over, we won't be getting to pick outside as much. There will be a few nice days and maybe another camping trip or two, but we're pretty much relegated to indoor events until next spring. Of course, this is a good time to start looking for a new axe – it never hurts to check out other

instruments, since you never know if one might speak to you. On a visit to Elderly Instruments in Lansing, Michigan, a few weeks ago, I happened onto a really great instrument: Tony Trishka's pre-war flathead Gibson banjo. It was interesting to me that the instrument says "Tokai" on the peghead. The instrument started life as a plectrum banjo, and it was originally converted to a 5-string by Frank Neat. Apparently, the Frank Neat neck suffered some irreparable damage, and, in a pinch, it was replaced with the Tokai neck, which is still living happily on the banjo! Although it was way out of my price range (an understatement), it sure was fun to dream about owning such a cornerstone of bluegrass history and imagine the performances and jam sessions it has seen! [editor: of course, I have a video of Mr. President playing this instrument. I was afraid we were going to have to bring it home!]

I was also surprised (and pleased) to learn that Elderly Instruments was designated "America's Top Small Business" for 2023 by the U.S. Chamber of Commerce "for its ability to embrace change, adapt to new challenges, and constantly innovate while remaining true to the company's 50-year legacy and heritage." They were chosen from a field of over 15,000 applicants from all 50 states.

Although all businesses have issues from time to time, I have always felt that Elderly puts a high emphasis on the quality of their customer


